dining in recent weeks. "Since we've opened back up, we're getting better than 75 percent back," said Charlie "Tuna" Conrad, who with his wife, Debi, owns and operates the downtown spot for breakfast and lunch at Fourth and Main streets. "A lot of it is because we started the carryout business during time we were closed down."

Flashbacks also provides free delivery to roughly a 2.5-mile radius of the community.

"We offer free delivery for those stuck at home," Conrad said.

Debi is no stranger to the restaurant business. Flashbacks has been in business the past five years. Before that, the

dine in, though tables are spaced at least 6 feet apart and available seating is about 50% capacity. "We've had some out-

standing customers," Tuna said. "They supported us when we didn't have dine in at all." Flashbacks got a bit of

a makeover while just offering carryout and delivery. Tuna said that some new pictures and frames were posted on the walls, among other updates. "We cleaned from one

corner to the next," Tuna said. "We got a lot of compliments on that."

"We were hopping to do a renovation in the next vear," Breuer said. " That was our big goal and then COVID hit and we hit our brakes."

Some of the potential future plans: updating the store and adding a consultation room for providing vaccines "and a little more clinical stuff," Breuer said.

She also would like to add more local products to the store's shelves, such as local honey, for instance.

"I know there's just some local people who do some neat things who I've got my eye on to bring that in to go along with the Booster Club," Breuer explained. "I kind of want this to be a destination to get to see some neat stuff about our town.'




